  - Author:** Who's the author? What are his/her credentials?
  - Purpose:** What's the author's intent in this article?—Is this intent in line with your research project?
  - Publisher:** Does the publisher of this journal have a solid reputation in this academic discipline?
  - Audience:** Who's the audience of this work?
  - Current/Historical:** Do you need current data? Does this journal article supply current data?  
 Do you need a historical perspective in your project? Does this article do that?
  - Accuracy:** How reliable is the data?
  - Organization:** Is the information clear, well-organized? Do charts/graphs advance the arguments made in the article?
  - References:** Are there references cited at the end of the article? Do they support the research?
9. **Do you have to modify your search? Why? How?**  
 Was your search too narrow? What will you do? Was your search too broad? What will you do?

**Critiquing/Evaluating Journal Articles:****Some Things to Consider****1. Author**

- What is the author's credentials/expertise (an expert on the topic or scholar in the discipline)?
- What is the author's educational background?
- What position/institutional affiliation did this individual hold when the material was published?
- Has this author published other material on the same or related subjects?

**2. Intent or Purpose**

Why did the author write this material? Examples include: providing information, fulfilling a grant requirement, original research, paper presented at a conference, expansion of a thesis/dissertation, review article, or summary of on-going research. Intent is often stated in the abstract or in introductory paragraphs. Journal articles tend to be either empirical (an argument supported by numbers) or rhetorical (an argument of words) or a review of the literature (for example, a review of what's been written in some area of patient care). Empirical arguments may be based on quantitative or qualitative research, depending on the method used to gather data. (Qualitative may be interviews, etc.)

**3. Publisher**

Are you familiar with other works/journals published by this company, or are you familiar with this specific journal? Does it have a solid reputation in the discipline?

**4. Audience**

Toward whom is this work written (e.g. student, researcher, lay person)?  
What tone, vocabulary, and writing styles are used?

**5. Currency**

How current is the material discussed? Is currency an important factor for your research?  
Have there been changes regarding this research topic since this material was published?  
What subject(s) is/are covered?  
How well/to what depth is/are the subject(s) covered?

**6. Accuracy**

How reliable is the information?  
Can the information be verified in some other source?  
Is there any bias evident or has the author maintained objectivity?  
If the article is original research, what was the method used (survey, etc.) to collect data, and is the method convincing?  
Are the summary statements convincing?

**7. Organization**

Is the material clear, logical, well-organized (headings help!)  
Do graphs, charts, or illustration clearly advance the author's argument and purpose?  
Is the article understandably written or is it filled with jargon that makes it difficult to read?

**8. References**

Does the author cite any other works to support research? Few or many?  
What is the quality of provided references? Contemporary to the article or much older?

**9. Overall**

How well does the material meet your research topic?  
How does this work compare with others you located in your project/paper/assignment/research?

**I. WRITING A LITERATURE REVIEW:** A Lit Review analyzes and synthesizes prior research on a theorist and a theory.  
(For other classes, the Lit Review would analyze and synthesize prior research on a specific topic.)

**A LITERATURE REVIEW includes:** Books  
Journal Articles  
Magazine Articles (sometimes—if it supports your research)  
DVDs, CDs, a SPEECH by a theorist, a PERSONAL INTERVIEW by a theorist, LETTERS by the theorist, etc.—any resource that will support your research. Check with your professor for clarification.  
Primary and Secondary Sources

**TYPES OF SOURCES:** Primary Sources—books/journal articles, interviews, etc., by the theorist  
Secondary Sources—books/journal articles, etc., by others “commenting on or critiquing” the theory. For example: your textbook.  
Foundational or Seminal Articles—first time the theory is discussed by the theorist

## II. ACCESSING DATABASES FROM OFF-CAMPUS

On the Library Web Site, click on the link entitled: “Accessing Databases from Off-Campus.”

- Read all of the information.
- The browser, Mozilla Firefox, works best with the Library’s proxy server.
- After you have installed it, you might need to restart your computer.
- Go back to the Library Web Site. Choose a database. When you are asked for a USERNAME and PASSWORD, type the USERNAME and PASSWORD that you use to access your Vanguard email.

## III. VANGUARD UNIVERSITY FULL-TEXT ELECTRONIC JOURNALS

This is an **index** to all online journals in the Library’s Databases. This is helpful if you know the title of a journal and you want to browse all of the issues online.

“Public Health: Regulation of Health Care” (2 journals)

#### VIII. PLAGIARISM—Plagiarism is not acceptable at VUSC.

1. **Three-word rule.**  
If you cite **3 consecutive words**, you must put quotations around the words and cite the source and page number.
2. If you quote **40 words or more in a row**, you must use a **block quote** and cite the source and page number. (See APA, MLA, TURABIAN, or CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE to determine the appropriate way to cite your quotations.)
3. In research papers or book reviews that you prepare for any nursing course, you will be sharing concepts developed by the author/authors. **When you paraphrase the author's/authors' words, you must cite the page/paragraph from which you gleaned the ideas.** Even though your paraphrase is not a direct quote, you must cite the page/paragraph. Otherwise, you will be stealing their intellectual property. The ideas/concepts are owned by the authors, and you are merely rephrasing their words.

**IN-CLASS ASSIGNMENT:** Begin work on your Literature Review.  
Show your findings to the Faculty Librarian or to your professor before you leave.

**We suggest strongly that you download and set up the Mozilla Firefox browser for this purpose only.** We have found that this browser works best with our system. If you are in the US, go to this link

Here's what the US Firefox download screen looks like:



When you download, a popup should ask you if you want to run, save or cancel. Choose **RUN**. Continue through the steps of downloading and installing Firefox. It might ask you if you want to make Firefox your default browser. Usually, the answer is **no**, if you use Internet explorer for all other searching. **If you are successful, the Firefox icon should appear on your desktop.**

Then follow these instructions exactly:

### **Instructions for setting up Mozilla Firefox 2.0 for Windows**

1. Open your Mozilla Firefox browser which you have downloaded.
2. Click the **Tools** menu (near the top) and select **Options** from the drop-down list that appears.
3. Click the **Advanced** icon on the right side of the **Options** box.
4. Choose the second tab, the **Network** tab.
5. At the top of the network box, which says "Connection: Configure how Firefox connects to the Internet," click **Settings**.
6. In the Connection Settings box that appears, click the last radio button, labeled **Automatic proxy configuration URL:**
7. Then, in the text-box directly beneath the button you just clicked, type <http://vanpac.vanguard.edu/proxy/vuproxy.pac> **Be careful! This must be typed without error.**
8. Finally, click **OK** at the bottom of the **Connection Settings** box. Click **OK** once more at the bottom of the **Network** box.
9. Go to the library home page (<http://www.vanguard.edu/library>).
10. When you click on any database, two boxes will appear. In the first box, type your **username**; in the second box, type your **password (the same you would use for accessing your Vanguard email)**. This was given to you by IT when you started your academic program at Vanguard. Again, if you haven't received your username and password for Vanguard email, contact the IT help desk using this email address: [helpdesk@vanguard.edu](mailto:helpdesk@vanguard.edu))

These instructions are also on the library web site under the "Connect from Off Campus" link at [http://www.vanguard.edu/index.aspx?doc\\_id=5320](http://www.vanguard.edu/index.aspx?doc_id=5320) That page also includes instructions for setting up Internet Explorer and Netscape if you need to use those two options as your browser.

**Finally, you might have a problem connecting to the proxy server if you are going through a firewall at work or at home. Also, if you have tried to access the databases four (4) times with no success, the system automatically locks you out.** We suggest you email the help desk at VU if either of these is your situation.
